## COVID-19 Safety Protocols- 2021 Eco Explorers Summer Camps

The Arboretum at Flagstaff's 2021 Eco Explorers Camp is following the COVID-19 safety protocols described below for all summer camps. All campers and camp families are required to adhere to these protocols.

This plan outlines the protocols that have been designed to ensure a safe and healthy environment for all campers and staff. These protocols align with the CDC's <u>Guidance for Child</u> <u>Care Programs that Remain Open</u>, the American Camp Association's <u>COVID-19 Resource</u> <u>Center</u> and the Arizona Department of Health Services guidelines. These guidelines are subject to change based on local, state, and federal directions to operate. The following restrictions, maintenance protocols and monitoring guidelines will be in effect throughout the 2021 Eco Explorers Camp programming to ensure the health and safety of all participants:

## **Restrictions:**

- Camps are limited to 14 campers in each age grouping (5-7 & 8-11)
- No more than 2 staff members per age group
- Staff, campers and guardians are required to wear masks at all times, unless eating during the designated meal periods
- Most activities will take place outdoors and are designed to keep six feet between campers
- When inclement weather requires it, Indoor activities will be socially distanced as best as possible. Masks will be required.
- Campers are required to wash and/or sanitize hands regularly throughout each day
- Supplies are not shared between the different age groups
- Campers will bring their own lunches, snacks and water bottles
- Sharing of food between campers is be prohibited, unless from the same family
- Signs will be posted advising campers that they should:
  - $\circ$  ~ avoid entering the facility if they have a cough or fever
  - wear facial coverings
  - maintain social distancing, and
  - not engage in unnecessary physical contact
- Campers and staff will be screened upon arrival daily for symptoms consistent with those of COVID-19 and history of exposure, including the use of touchless thermometers
- Campers must not have a temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher and will be asked to confirm that they do not have any of the symptoms that the CDC has indicated are symptoms of COVID-19.

## **Maintenance Protocols**

- The Arb will provide adequate supplies for good hygiene, including soap, water, paper towels, and alcohol based hand sanitizer
- Each person entering the facility will be required to sanitize their hands on entry
- High touch surfaces will be sanitized frequently
- Frequent hand washing routines will be incorporated into daily camp schedules
- Doors will remain propped open wherever possible when campers are indoors
- Guardians will be instructed to screen children and themselves before leaving home each dav
- Anyone with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 may not remain at The Arb and will be isolated from other campers while waiting for a guardian to arrive for pickup
- Any participant with a fever of 100 degrees or higher will not be allowed to enter the facility
- The Summer Camp Coordinator (Helena Murray) is the designated primary contact for campers, guardians, and staff
- All staff will be trained in the above safety procedures

## **Monitoring Protocols**

- Staff will be on site to monitor compliance of parents/guardians, campers, and employees
- The Summer Camp Coordinator will conduct daily observations to monitor compliance and assess the effectiveness of these rules and regulations
- Recommendations will be made as necessary to modify this plan
